

- 2. All exhibits must be in place by 7:30 am on Saturday.
- 3. No exhibit may be removed before 3:00 pm on Saturday the day of the Fair.
- 4. Entry blanks must accompany all entries & can be found in this premium list. Entry blanks that are mailed should be received before Wednesday. Entry blanks may be brought to the hall with exhibits.
- 5. All entries must be made, grown, selected and arranged by the exhibitor since the last fair. All entries must be entered by an individual.
- 6. An exhibitor may make only one entry in a given category.
- 7. New classes may be created at the discretion of the fair management, provided there are three or more exhibitors.
- 8. Youth exhibits are for boys & girls between age 4 and 20 as of Jan.1st of the current year. Age must be included on the entry form for all youth exhibits.
- 9. The committee reserves the right to reject any and/or all those exhibits that are not listed in the premium list and also those of undesirable quality.

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#### WHAT THE JUDGES LOOK FOR

#### **Vegetables & Fruits**

- 1] Exact number of specimens as called for in the premium list & prepared as specified in the premium list
- 2] Uniformity each specimen like each other in size, shape and color
- 3] Quality not too large, not too small, fine texture
- 4] Freedom from blemishes no cuts, bruises, insect injury or disease
- 5] Cleanliness produce washed or wiped as one would prepare for market
- 6] Carrots, turnips & parsnips cut tops to ½ inch, leave tap root
- 7] Onions cut tops to 1 inch, wipe clean
- 8] Cabbage & Cauliflower cut off roots, remove outer leaves
- 9] Squash & Pumpkins leave stems on
- 10] Potatoes wiped dry, do not wash
- 11] Tomatoes Red, stems off; Green, stems on
- 12] Peppers all should have the same number of lobes

#### **Canned Goods**

- 1. Products should be of the best quality, uniform in size, and of good color
- 2. The liquid should be clear, free from sediment & proper amount in jar
- 3. The container should be uniform, clean, properly sealed and labeled

#### **Baked Food**

- 1. Foods are to be properly covered using transparent materials and accompanied by the recipe



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

The Grange was formed in 1867 as a Fraternal Organization following the American Civil War to unite American citizens in improving conditions for the nation's rural and farm populations. Grange was the 1st organization in America to include all members of the family. Since its founding, Grange women had an equal vote with men & held any Office. Granges were warehouse-buying clubs of the 19th century & members received no-interest loans. The Grange is credited for the Rural Free Delivery Program of the US Post Office. Grange members also created libraries to share books, many of which have become the community public libraries of today. Their influence grew into a nonpartisan effort that worked to create laws that are now known as the anti-trust 'Granger Laws'. For over 150 years, Grange has been serving rural families & promoting local agriculture. Upton Grange has received the National "Distinguished Grange Award" which only 40 of the 2,000 local chapters across the USA have received. Upton Junior Grange provides agricultural awareness, activities, arts, crafts, & leadership training for kids ages 5 to 14. At age 14, kids join their Families as members of Upton Grange, Annual Family Membership Dues are \$60, a year (only \$5, a month) for all Parents & Kids in your Household! 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

All articles must be made by the exhibitor during the past 12 months. Articles will be judged based on condition of article, suitability, construction, workmanship, design, color, originality and ease of care.

- **1] Afghan** (excluding Baby Afghans): May be made using any yarn product (or product suitable to entry). It can be any pattern and it may be knitted, crocheted, woven, etc. No smaller than twin size.
- **2] Baby Afghan:** May be made using any yarn product (or product suitable to entry). It can be any pattern and it may be knitted, crocheted, woven, etc.
- **3] Doilies:** May be knitted, crocheted or tatted. May use any thread suitable to article. May be any pattern or design.
- **4] Embroidery:** Any embroidered item except Counted Cross Stitch. Any embroidery thread may be used. Pillowcases must be submitted as a pair. Pictures may be in frames, but the back of the work must be visible and NO GLASS.
- **5] 3-Piece Baby Set:** Set may consist of bonnet, jacket, booties or mittens; THREE pieces for the same child. May be knitted or crocheted using any suitable pattern.
  - 6] Plastic Canvas: Any item made with any pattern using yarn or thread.
- 7] Counted Cross Stitch: Any item using any thread product. NOTE: The back of work MUST be seen on all embroidered pieces. Pictures may be on stretcher strips or may be framed &/or matted, but NO GLASS.
- **8] Adult Garment:** Item must be for an adult. May be sweater, dress, vest, poncho, cape etc. May be knitted or crocheted using any pattern and any product thread suitable to entry.
- **9] Child Garment:** Item must be for an child. May be sweater, dress, vest, poncho, cape etc. May be knitted or crocheted using any pattern and any product thread suitable to entry.
- 10] Latch Hook: Any item made with any pattern, using any yarn. Maximum size 18" x 18".
- 11] Quilted Wall Hanging: Hand or machine quilted, any product used for filler. Max.size 18" x 18".
- **12] Quilt** Large: May be hand or machine guilted and any product may be used for filler.
- **13] Handmade Pillow** Maximum Size 18" x 18" may be decorated if desired.
- 14] Set of 4 Place mats
- **15] Stuffed Toy** must be safe for child under 3: Toy may be knitted, crocheted, stitched, etc. & stuffed with any brand of fiberfill. All trimmings must be secure, no sharp edges or protrusions, no buttons or hooks. Glue, paste or paint must be non-toxic. Loose knitted or crocheted toys should be lined.

Upton Grange Hall, on 26 School Street, was built in 1848 & was the town's 1st public high school (Center School). The 175 year old Grange Hall building is listed as an Upton Historic building (UPT.176) by the MA Historical Commission & has an Historic Plague in front of the Hall. In 1925 the Grange bought the School house & has worked to preserve it for 100 years. We have received a CPC Grant from the Town of Upton & a MA Historical Grant to restore the outside of the Building. We sponsor the St. Pauly Clothing Recycling Shed to give used apparel to the needy for free. We support local agriculture with our Free Seed Library & Gardener's Exchange Shed and have held 80 Agricultural Harvest Fairs. Upton Junior Grange provides agricultural awareness, activities, arts, crafts, & leadership Training for kids ages 5 to 14. At age 14, kids join their Families as members of Upton Grange. Annual Family Membership Dues are \$60. yr (\$5. a month for all Family in your Home.) Upton Grange meets every 2nd Thursday at 7:00 pm. 


